AIM OF THIS BROCHURE

The aim of this brochure is to inform you about the opportunities SCOPE has to offer regarding active membership. Specifically, it provides you with an overview of all currently open committees. WHAT IS SCOPE?

SCOPE is a career booster. SCOPE helps you have a successful start in your career by connecting you to the right people and giving you personal development opportunities that SBE does not offer you. We enhance the SBE curriculum with hands-on experience, making you a more complete student.

Being the official study association of the Maastricht University School of Business and Economics, SCOPE has over 6,000 passive members for whom over 70 activities are organized every academic year. SCOPE's events are divided into **four pillars: Academic, Career, Development, and Social.** Becoming active in organizing these events enables you to strengthen your skills and bridge the gap between theory and practice.

Since the SBE educates a broad range of young professionals across many industries, SCOPE is organized to mirror the diversity of its students and enable them to focus on an area of their studies that they find most interesting. Therefore, being active at SCOPE means that you will be part of a pillar that targets students with similar interests as you. Together with activities from other pillars, you will join integration activities and other social events. Together you will be part of our SCOPE family!



WHAT DO THE PILLARS DO?

The **academic pillar** is focused on enhancing students' academic capabilities by organizing events with SBE's professors as well as business professionals.

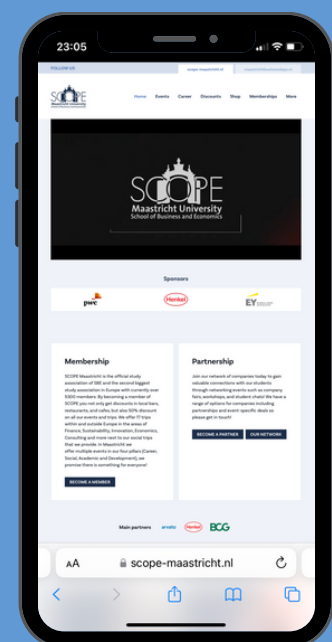

In order to do so, please go to <https://scope-maastricht.nl/about-us/active-membership-application>. This will bring you to our form which you need to fill in. Here you can also upload your **CV**. Once you filled out the registration form completely and click “send”, you will immediately receive an e-mail with further information regarding the application process. This email will contain all the relevant information for your **interview**, which will take place at the SCOPE office within the next weeks.

Registrations close on January 31st at 23:59h, so be sure to upload your files before the deadline!
